	Sec. 2. Study. The Department of Human Services shall conduct
46	an in-depth study of pharmacy services prior to changing the
48	dispensing fee for pharmacy service claims. This study must determine the full cost of filling a prescription and providing
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pharmacy services, including reasonable profits, in the Medicaid program pursuant to the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 22, chapter 2 855, the Cub Care program pursuant to Title 22, section 3174-T, the elderly low-cost drug program pursuant to Title 22, section 4 254 and the Maine resident low-cost prescription drug program pursuant to Title 22, section 254-B. The department shall б consider the results of this study when determining pharmacy reimbursement rates. The Governor's proposed supplemental budget for 2000-2001, LD 2510 as adjusted with 40 proposed changes, includes General Fund appropriations totaling \$1,675,313 and a Federal Expenditures Fund allocation of 42 \$12,071,402 in fiscal year 2000-01 for this purpose. 44 The Department of Human Services will incur some minor additional costs to submit the required report. These costs can 46 be absorbed within the department's existing budgeted resources. 48 The additional costs associated with conducting an in-depth study of pharmacy services and submitting the required report can

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be absorbed by the Department of Human Services utilizing existing budgeted resources.'

SUMMARY

This amendment replaces the bill. The amendment:

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1. Provides a new title;

Requires the Department of Human Services to develop and
 implement a comprehensive electronic claims-filing system available to all providers in the Medicaid program. The system
 must be funded with state and federal funds. The amendment requires a report to the joint standing committee of the
 Legislature having jurisdiction over health and human services matters by January 2, 2002 on the pharmacy services study;

3. Requires the Department of Human Services to conduct an 20 in-depth study of pharmacy services prior to changing the dispensing fee for pharmacy service claims. This study must determine the full cost of filling a prescription and providing 22 pharmacy services, including reasonable profits, in the Medicaid 24 program, Cub Care program, elderly low-cost drug program and Maine resident low-cost prescription drug program. The 26 department is required to consider the results of this study when determining pharmacy reimbursement rates. By January 2, 2002, 28 the department is required to report to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over health and 30 human services matters the results of the study of the pharmacy services; and 32
