Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows: 2 Sec. 1. 22 MRSA §3104, sub-§13 is enacted to read: 4 13. Categorical eligibility. The department shall adopt 6 rules that maximize access to the food stamp program for households that include a minor child, but do not receive a 8 monthly cash assistance grant from the Temporary Assistance for Needy Families program. Under rules adopted pursuant to this subsection, certain of these families must be authorized to 10 receive referral services provided through the Temporary 12 Assistance to Needy Families block grant and be categorically eligible for food stamps in accordance with federal law. Rules 14 adopted pursuant to this subsection are routine technical rules as defined in Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter II-A. 16 **SUMMARY** 18 20 The purposes of this bill are to provide information about services to help low-income families maintain employment and to eliminate certain barriers to receiving food stamps for those 22 families. Under current law there is a vehicle asset limit that prevents certain families that own dependable vehicles from 24 receiving food stamps. This bill authorizes certain low-income households to receive referral services through the Temporary 26 Assistance to Needy Families block grant, and makes such

28 households categorically eligible for food stamps.
