	Education will be responsible for the special education costs.
34	The total amount required will depend on the number of juveniles committed, the length of the commitment and the cost and location
36	of the specific facility. These costs can not be estimated at
	this time.

40	The Department of Corrections may also experience savings if this provision results in housing fewer juveniles at a juvenile
	correctional facility. The amount of savings, if any, can not be
