2	Sec. 1. 34-A MRSA §3063-B enacted to read:
4	§3063-B. Transporting to and from courts
6	1. Transporting of clients. When a client is transported
8 10	to and from a court in this State from a correctional facility, the department is responsible for the transportation.
	2. Cost of transfer. The department shall pay the cost of
12	the transfer or return of a client from a court if any other law enforcement agency provides the transportation.

18	to this section, the department shall pay directly to the agency an amount computed at a per diem per capita rate established by
