32	Under current practice, the University of Maine School of Law is self-supported; that is, other than funding for the
34	library, the cost of running the law school is paid through tuition. The School of Law is the only school within the
36	University of Maine System where this is the case.
38	This resolve requires the University of Maine System to annually fund the School of Law at a rate comparable to the
40	funding provided to other schools within the University of Maine System and provides funds for that purpose.
