

2 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:**

4 **Sec. 1. 25 MRSA §1502, 4th ¶**, as amended by PL 1993, c. 123,
§1, is further amended to read:

6 The State Police may provide assistance to federal agencies
7 and other entities and persons. The Chief of the State Police
8 may charge the various federal agencies and other entities and
9 persons for these services. Revenues received from these
10 agencies and other entities and persons must be allocated for the
11 purpose of funding the cost of providing the services.

14 **SUMMARY**

16 This bill would allow the State Police to provide services
17 to entities and persons, e.g. traffic control to utility
18 companies, and to charge for providing the services. The revenue
19 collected would be allocated for the purpose of funding the cost
20 of providing the services.
