The amendment creates a 15-member study commission to review existing 8 federal and state laws regarding the manufacture, sale, possession and use of handquns; to identify barriers to 10 enforcement of those laws in Maine; to propose changes to those laws if necessary; to use the principles of responsible gun 12 ownership to identify methods to improve safety and protect citizens from unintended, as well as intended, injury; and to 14 identify effective handgun-related educational programs that prevent misuse and abuse of handguns for all age groups and 16 identify a sustainable funding source to ensure that these programs are available to all. The commission shall report its 18 findings and any recommended legislation to the First Regular Session of the 120th Legislature by November 1, 2000. The 20 amendment also adds an appropriation and a fiscal note.
