\$1612. Death benefit

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- 1. Amount: recipients. In a case in which the chief determines under rules adopted pursuant to this section that a law enforcement officer has died while in the line of duty, the State shall pay a benefit of \$50,000 as follows:
- A. If there is no surviving child of the officer, to the surviving spouse of such officer;
- B. If there is a surviving child or children and a surviving spouse, 1/2 to the surviving child or children of the officer in equal shares and 1/2 to the surviving spouse;
- 20 <u>C. If there is no surviving spouse, to the child or children of the officer in equal shares; or</u>
 - D. If there is no surviving child or spouse of the officer, to the parent or parents of the officer in equal shares.
- 2. Interim benefit payment. When the chief determines, upon showing of need and prior to final action, that the death of an officer is one for which a benefit will probably be paid, the chief may make an interim benefit payment not exceeding \$3,000 to the individual or individuals entitled to receive a benefit under subsection 1 in the manner set out in subsection 1.
 - 3. Deduction of interim payment. The chief shall deduct the amount of an interim payment made pursuant to subsection 2 from the amount of any final benefit paid to the individual or individuals entitled to receive a benefit under subsection 1.
- 4. Repayment of interim payment; waiver. If a final benefit is not paid, the recipient or recipients of any interim payment under subsection 2 are liable for repayment of the amount received. The chief may waive all or part of the repayment if the chief determines that undue hardship would result from that repayment.
- 5. Execution or attachment prohibited. A benefit paid under this section is not subject to execution or attachment.
- 6. Other benefits. The \$50,000 benefit payable under this section may not be considered a benefit paid under a "similar law" in Title 5, sections 18005 and 18605 and may not be used to

Maine Learning Technology Endowment will avoid the diversion of funds that may have otherwise been available for transfer to the Maine Rainy Day Fund, the Retirement Allowance Fund, the State Contingent Account and the Reserve for General Fund Operating Capital.

The amendment also includes a General Fund appropriation of \$29,627,290 in fiscal year 2000-01 to provide funding for the psychiatric treatment facility to replace Part NNN, the Maine Governmental Facilities Authority authorization to issue up to \$33,000,000 of securities for the facility. The elimination of Part NNN will reduce debt service costs, a portion of which would be eligible for federal reimbursement. This will reduce the amounts that will accrue to the Retirement Allowance Fund to reduce the unfunded liability in future years pursuant to Part OOO.

This amendment also adds a new Part providing initial funding through a \$50,000 General Fund appropriation in fiscal year 2000-01 to the Department of Public Safety for state death benefits for law enforcement officers killed in the line of duty. The department will also require additional General Fund appropriations and Highway Fund allocations if more than one benefit payment is made in fiscal year 2000-01. The additional amounts that may be required can not be estimated at this time.

This amendment also provides a General Fund appropriation of \$330,420 in fiscal year 2000-01 to the Maine State Retirement System to reduce the unfunded liability of the system.

32 SUMMARY

This amendment removes language that establishes the Maine Learning Technology Endowment and the Education Technology Reserve. It includes a General Fund appropriation to provide funding for the psychiatric treatment facility and removes language that authorizes the Maine Governmental Facilities Authority to issue securities to finance the construction of the

facility. It also establishes state death benefits for law enforcement officers killed in the line of duty and provides funds to reduce the unfunded liability of the Maine State Retirement System.
