SENATE AMENDMENT "A" to COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 1807, L.D. 2533, Bill, "An Act to Create a New Category of Liquor License and to Exempt Pool Halls, Bowling Alleys and Off-track Betting Facilities from the Prohibition Against Smoking"

Amend the amendment by striking out the substitute title and replacing it with the following:

**'An Act to Amend the Liquor Laws to Create a New Category of License for Pool Halls and Exempt Certain Facilities from the Prohibition Against Smoking'**

Further amend the amendment by striking out all of section 3, (page 2, lines 1 to 10 in amendment)

Further amend the amendment in section 6 by striking out all of the amending clause (page 2, line 20 in amendment) and inserting in its place the following:

**'Sec. 6. 28-A MRSA §1051, sub-§6 is enacted to read:'**

Further amend the amendment in section 6 by striking out all of subsection 6 (page 2, lines 22 to 31 in amendment) and renumbering subsection 7 to be subsection 6.


Further amend the amendment by relettering or renumbering any nonconsecutive Part letter or section number to read consecutively.

**FISCAL NOTE**

Removing certain facilities from a licensure category will  
reduce the estimated General Fund revenue loss by approximately  
\$23,800 beginning in fiscal year 2000-01.

**SUMMARY**

This amendment removes the provisions of Committee Amendment  
"A" that define "self-contained lounges" as lounges, thus  
removing the exemption from smoking restrictions for such lounges.
