SUMMARY

This bill requires the Department of Education and every school administrative unit in the State to provide professional development to the unit's administrators, teachers and educational technicians and to develop a professional development plan. This bill also requires the department to summarize the performance of these plans and report this summary to the Legislature every 2 years and to award grants to school administrative units that need to bring their plans to standards or that have special professional development needs.
