calculations, this bill will redistribute approximately \$21,400,
increasing the amounts to be received by the Town of Standish and reducing the amounts to be received by other municipalities.

The Office of the Treasurer of State and the Department of 6 Education will incur some minor additional costs to adjust the revenue-sharing and school subsidy distributions. These costs 8 can be absorbed within the agencies' existing budgeted resources.

10 Depending on the effective date of this bill, Cumberland County may be required to recalculate county taxes. If so, this 12 recalculation would represent a state mandate pursuant to the Constitution of Maine. The additional local costs are expected 14 to be minor. Unless General Fund appropriations are provided to fund at least 90% of the additional costs or a Mandate Preamble 16 is amended to the bill and 2/3 of the members of each House vote to exempt this mandate from the funding requirement, Cumberland 18 County may not be required to implement these changes.'

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## **SUMMARY**

This amendment makes corrections to the original bill and 24 adds a fiscal note.
