#### APPROPRIATIONS/ALLOCATIONS

General Fund \$95,687 Other Funds (\$30,942)

 This bill includes a General Fund appropriation of \$95,687 in fiscal year 2000-01 for the Administration - Environmental Protection program within the Department of Environmental Protection to transfer one Deputy Commissioner position from the Board of Environmental Protection Fund to the General Fund.

 This bill also includes a corresponding Other Special Revenue funds deallocation to the Board of Environmental Protection Fund of \$95,687 in fiscal year 2000-01 to accomplish the transfer of the Deputy Commissioner position to the General Fund.

 This bill includes an Other Special Revenue funds allocation of \$64,745 in fiscal year 2000-01 for the Board of Environmental Protection Fund to cover the costs of creating one Executive Analyst position for the Board of Environmental Protection.'

**SUMMARY** 

This amendment is the majority report of the committee. The amendment changes the title of the professional staff position for the Board of Environmental Protection to "executive analyst" and sets the salary level within salary range 85. The amendment specifies that the position is unclassified and removes the reference to "major policy-influencing position." The amendment strikes from the bill the allocation for the Executive Director of the Board of Environmental Protection position, replaces it with a new allocation for the Executive Analyst position and specifies that the executive analyst may be hired no earlier than October 1, 2000.

The amendment specifies that the executive analyst of the board is prohibited from participating in any activity that substantially compromises the executive analyst's ability to discharge effectively and impartially the duties of the position. The amendment specifies that the Commissioner of Environmental Protection shall make recommendations to the board

- regarding matters considered by the board and shall provide the board with the technical services of the department.
- The amendment clarifies that public notice of a meeting that is not a public hearing but at which the Board of Environmental Protection will accept additional public comment on a proposed rule must comply with the general public notice requirements for public proceedings.
- The amendment also adds a fiscal note to the bill.
