

2           **Emergency preamble. Whereas,** Acts and resolves of the  
Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after  
adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

6           **Whereas,** the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, chapter 375,  
subchapter II-A requires legislative authorization before major  
substantive agency rules may be finally adopted by the agency; and

10          **Whereas,** the above-named major substantive rule has been  
submitted to the Legislature for review; and

12          **Whereas,** immediate enactment of this resolve is necessary to  
record the Legislature's position on final adoption of the rule;  
and

16          **Whereas,** in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts  
create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of  
Maine and require the following legislation as immediately  
necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and  
safety; now, therefore, be it

22          **Sec. 1. Adoption. Resolved:** That final adoption of Chapter  
305: Rules and Regulations Pertaining to Traffic Movement  
Permits, a provisionally adopted major substantive rule of the  
Department of Transportation, that has been submitted to the  
Legislature for review pursuant to the Maine Revised Statutes,  
Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter II-A is authorized.

28          **Emergency clause.** In view of the emergency cited in the  
preamble, this resolve takes effect when approved.
