**SUMMARY** 

22 This amendment replaces the original bill. It repeals the special taste-testing festival license in current law and 24 replaces it with one that is applied for jointly by Maine small breweries and wineries. The special taste-testing festival 26 license is for the purpose of promoting Maine small breweries and wineries. The license fee per brewery or winery is \$20.

The amendment also adds a fiscal note to the bill.

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
