## **SUMMARY**

8 This amendment replaces the bill, changes the title and changes the form of the bill to a resolve. It directs the Attorney General to convene a task force to study and make recommendations on implementation of the marijuana for medical purposes law and access to marijuana for medical purposes. It provides for the appointment of legislative members of the task force. It requires a report to the Joint Standing Committee on Health and Human Services and the Joint Standing Committee on Criminal Justice by October 1, 2000.
