14	1. Appeal of license denial. A person denied a licens identified in subsection 2 because that person does not meet th eligibility requirements for that license may appeal under thi
16	section for a review of that license denial.
18	2. Limited-entry license. This section applies to th following licenses:
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22	<u>A. A Class I. Class II or Class III lobster and cra</u> fishing license:
24	B. An elver fishing license; and
26	<u>C. A handfishing sea urchin license; a sea urchin draggin</u> license; and a sea urchin hand-raking and trapping license.
28	3. License Appeals Board; purpose. The License Appeal
30	Board, established in Title 5, section 12004-I, subsection 57- and referred to in this section as the "board," shall consider
32	appeals on an individual basis from a person appealing a licens denial under this section and shall make a recommendation to th
34	commissioner for the commissioner's approval or denial of the appeal.

38	4. Board members appointment; term; compensation. The boar consists of 8 members, except that 3 members of the boar
40	selected by the commissioner to preside over each appeal shall
40	perform the duties of the board for that appeal as provided is subsection 5. The commissioner shall appoint the members a
42	follows:
44	A. Two public members who do not hold licenses under the Part; and

48	B. Six members who are licensed under this Part to enga- in commercial harvesting activities in limited-ent fisheries, including 2 members holding lobster and cr

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fishing licenses, 2 members holding elver fishing licenses and 2 2 members holding sea urchin harvesting licenses. 4 A board member serves for a 3-year term and continues serving until a successor is appointed. A member may not serve for more than 2 consecutive terms. In the case of a vacancy, the 6 commissioner shall fill promptly the vacancy. Members are 8 compensated as provided in Title 5, chapter 379. 10 5. Meetings; powers and duties. The commissioner shall convene a meeting of the board within 30 days of receipt of a 12 written request for review of a license denial. The commissioner shall select 3 members of the board to preside over each appeal 14 as follows: 16 A. One of the public members; 18 B. One of the members licensed under this Part to engage in commercial harvesting activities in a limited-entry fishery 20 not related to the license for which the appeal is requested; and 22 C. One of the members licensed under this Part to engage in 24 commercial harvesting activities in the limited-entry fishery for which the appeal is requested. 26 A quorum of 3 members is required to begin a meeting or take any 28 action. The board shall make a written recommendation to the commissioner regarding the issuance of a license. The board may 30 recommend that the commissioner issue a license only if the board finds that the applicable criteria in subsection 7 or 8 are met. 32 The commissioner shall make the final decision to approve or deny the appeal. 34 6. Appeals process. A person appealing a license denial 36 under this section must request the review in writing. The board shall hold a hearing on the appeal if a hearing is requested in 38 writing within 10 days of the initial request. If a hearing is requested, it must be held within 30 days of the request unless a 40 longer period is agreed to by all parties in writing, and the hearing must be conducted in the Augusta area. 42 A hearing held under this subsection is informal. At the 44 hearing, the appellant may present any evidence concerning the criteria listed in subsection 7 or 8 that might justify issuing a 46 license to the person, and the board may request any additional information the board considers necessary. Any medical 48 information provided as part of the appeal is a confidential record for the purposes of Title 1, section 402, subsection 3, 50 paragraph A.

20	Issuance of a license on appeal is at the discretion of the
22	commissioner, except that a license may not be issued unless the

28	is repealed. SUMMARY This bill establishes an appeals process for a person denied
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license holder and the family would suffer undue financial hardship if the license and trap tags were not transferred.

4 The bill repeals the current process for a person to appeal the denial of a lobster and crab fishing license.
