6	Sec. 1. National Guard Education Assistance Pilot Program.
8	<b>Resolved:</b> That the National Guard Education Assistance Pilot Program is established.
10	1. Definitions. As used in this section, unless the
12	context otherwise indicates, the following terms have the following meanings.
14	A. "Course" means a class taught over a semester,
16	trimester, quarter or term.
18	B. "Degree program" means a course of study programmed to culminate in a specific degree, diploma or certificate.
20	C. "Maine National Guard member" or "member" means a member
22	of a federally recognized unit of the Maine National Guard.
24	D. "State postsecondary education institution" means the University of Maine System, the Maine Maritime Academy, the
26	Maine Technical College System or any other college or university system established as a public instrumentality in
28	this State.
30	E. "Tuition" means the total semester, trimester, quarter or term or classroom-hour cost of instruction to the student
32	as periodically published in the catalog of a state

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2. Tuition grant for Maine National Guard member. A Maine National Guard member who meets the prerequisites of subsection 3 is entitled to a 100% tuition grant at any state postsecondary

education institution. The Maine National Guard shall provide the cost of tuition to a member who meets the requirements of

2	3. Minimum prerequisites. To qualify for a tuition waiver pursuant to subsection 2, the Maine National Guard member must:
4	A. Have successfully completed basic training or received a commission;
6	B. Be a satisfactory participant in the Maine National

10	C. Enter into a written contractual commitment with the Maine National Guard to serve in the Maine National Guard
12	for at least one year beyond the end of the term for which a tuition grant is granted.
14	4. Cessation of benefits. The tuition grant benefits

18	A. Accumulation of 150 credit hours, or the equivalent, of tuition grant assistance by the Maine National Guard member;

	5. Restitution. Repayment of tuition waiver benefits is required pursuant to this subsection.
32	A. A Maine National Guard member shall repay the Maine

40	(2) The member completes but for which the member earns a grade lower than 2.0 on a 4.0 scale.

C. If the member does not fulfill the member's contractual obligation to the Maine National Guard as defined in subsection 3, paragraph C, then the Adjutant General shall notify the Maine National Guard member in writing that the member is liable for restitution and the member shall repay the Maine National Guard the full amount of the tuition grant received during the last school year.

A member may appeal the requirement to make restitution pursuant to this subsection if the member files a written notice of intent to appeal with the Adjutant General within 30 days of notice that the member is liable for restitution. During the pendency of the appeal, the requirement of restitution is postponed. If the Adjutant General determines that the member, in fact, met the requirements for restitution as described in paragraph A, B or C and that there were not sufficient extenuating circumstances to excuse the failure of the member to complete satisfactorily the course or participation in the Maine National Guard, the Adjutant General shall inform the member of this determination and the member shall make restitution to the Maine National Guard for those courses for which the Adjutant General determines the member is liable. The decision of the Adjutant General is final and may not be appealed.

6. In-state tuition rates. Regardless of the state of residence, a member of the Maine National Guard who has met the requirements of this section and is attending a state postsecondary education institution qualifies for in-state tuition rates; and be it further

Sec. 2. Data-keeping; report. Resolved: That the Department of Defense, Veterans and Emergency Management shall keep and analyze data on the effects of the education assistance pilot program on recruitment and retention of Maine National Guard members. The department shall report to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over legal and veterans' affairs in January 2001 and 2002; and be it further

Sec. 3. Funding cap. Resolved: That grants may not be made after June 30, 2001 or after the funds allocated in this resolve are exhausted, whichever is later; and be it further

Sec. 4. Application. Resolved: That this resolve applies to school semesters, trimesters, quarters or terms beginning on or after the effective date of this resolve; and be it further

Sec. 5. Appropriation. Resolved: That the following funds are appropriated from the General Fund to carry out the purposes of this resolve.

' 16 FISCAL NOTE 18 As amended, this bill includes a one-time General Fund appropriation to the Department of Defense, 20 Veterans and Emergency Management of \$300,000 in fiscal year 2000-01 for the 22 cost of tuition for eligible members of the Maine National Guard who participate in the education assistance pilot program. 24 The additional costs associated with analyzing data and 26 submitting the required report can be absorbed by the Department of Defense, Veterans and Emergency Management utilizing existing 28 budgeted resources. 30 **SUMMARY** 32 strikes the committee amendment. This amendment amendment changes the original bill to a resolve and creates a 34 pilot program that gives members of the Maine National Guard a 36 full grant of tuition at the University of Maine System, the Maine Maritime Academy, the Maine Technical College System and 38 any other Maine postsecondary education institution as long as the member maintains at least a 2.0 grade point average and 40 serves in the Maine National Guard for at least one year after the tuition assistance is granted. The tuition grant is given by the Maine National Guard. 42

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This amendment also qualifies a member of the Maine National Guard attending the University of Maine System, the Maine
