Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted 2 as emergencies; and 4 Whereas, the Maine National Guard is a valuable resource for the State of Maine; and 6 Whereas, those in service to Maine deserve to be recognized 8 and rewarded for their service; and 10 Whereas, it is imperative that this legislation take effect in time to allow members of the Maine National Guard to attend 12 classes in the summer; and 14 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of 16 Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and 18 safety; now, therefore, 20 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows: 22 Sec. 1. 37-B MRSA §387 is enacted to read: 24 §387. National Guard education assistance 26 1. Definitions. As used in this section, unless the context otherwise indicates, the following terms have the 28 following meanings. 30 "Course" means a class taught over a semester, Α. 32 trimester, guarter or term. 34 в. "Degree program" means a course of study programmed to culminate in a specific degree, diploma or certificate. 36 C. "Maine National Guard member" or "member" means a member of a federally recognized unit of the Maine National Guard. 38 40 D. "State postsecondary education institution" means the University of Maine System, the Maine Maritime Academy, the 42 Maine Technical College System or any other college or university system established as a public instrumentality in this State. 44 "Tuition" means the total semester, trimester, quarter 46 E. or term or classroom-hour cost of instruction to the student as periodically published in the catalog of a state 48 postsecondary education institution, including mandatory 50 fees and lab fees but excluding all other expenses such as book charges, room and board.

2	F. "Unsatisfactory participant" means a member of the Maine National Guard who has accumulated 9 or more unexcused
4	absences from unit training assemblies or who, without proper authority, fails to attend or complete the entire
6	period of annual training.
8	2. Tuition grant for Maine National Guard member. A Maine National Guard member who meets the prerequisites of subsection 3
10	is entitled to a 100% tuition grant at any state postsecondary education institution. The Maine National Guard shall provide
12	the cost of tuition to a member who meets the requirements of subsection 3.
14	3. Minimum prerequisites. To qualify for a tuition waiver
16	pursuant to subsection 2, the Maine National Guard member must:
18	A. Have successfully completed basic training or received a commission;
20	B. Be a satisfactory participant in the Maine National
22	Guard; and
24	<u>C. Enter into a written contractual commitment with the</u> Maine National Guard to serve in the Maine National Guard
26	for at least one year beyond the end of the term for which a tuition grant is granted.
28	4. Cessation of benefits. The tuition grant benefits
30	granted under this section cease upon:
32	A. Accumulation of 150 credit hours, or the equivalent, of tuition grant assistance by the Maine National Guard member;
34	
36	B. Unsatisfactory participation by the Maine National Guard member in the Maine National Guard as certified to the state postsecondary education institution by the Adjutant General;

40	<u>C. Failure by the Maine National Guard member to maintain good academic standing at the state postsecondary education</u>
42	institution.
44	5. Restitution. Repayment of tuition waiver benefits is required pursuant to this subsection.
46	
48	A. A Maine National Guard member shall repay the Maine National Guard the full amount of education assistance received for each course during the preceding semester,
50	trimester, guarter or term that:

2	(1) The member fails to complete; or
4	(2) The member completes but for which the member earns a grade lower than 2.0 on a 4.0 scale.

8	B. If the member becomes an unsatisfactory participant with the Maine National Guard or does not remain in good academic standing with the state postsecondary education institution,
10	then the Maine National Guard member shall repay the full amount of tuition grant received for all courses taken
12	during the preceding semester, trimester, quarter or term to the Maine National Guard.
14	
16	<u>C. If the member does not fulfill the member's contractual obligation to the Maine National Guard as defined in subsection 3, paragraph C, then the Adjutant General shall</u>
18	notify the Maine National Guard member in writing that the member is liable for restitution and the member shall repay
20	the Maine National Guard the full amount of the tuition grant received during the last school year.

	A member may appeal the requirement to make restitution pursuant
24	to this subsection if the member files a written notice of intent
	to appeal with the Adjutant General within 30 days of notice that
26	the member is liable for restitution. During the pendency of the appeal, the requirement of restitution is postponed. If the
28	Adjutant General determines that the member, in fact, met the requirements for restitution as described in paragraph A, B or C
30	and that there were not sufficient extenuating circumstances to excuse the failure of the member to complete satisfactorily the
32	course or participation in the Maine National Guard, the Adjutant General shall inform the member of this determination and the
34	member shall make restitution to the Maine National Guard for those courses for which the Adjutant General determines the
36	member is liable. The decision of the Adjutant General is final and may not be appealed.

	6. In-state tuition rates. A member of the Maine National
40	Guard who is attending a state postsecondary education institution gualifies for in-state tuition rates.

44	Sec. 2. Application. This Act applies to school semesters, trimesters, quarters or terms beginning on or after the effective
	date of this Act.

	This bill gives members of the Maine National Guard a full
6	grant of tuition at the University of Maine System, the Maine
	Maritime Academy, the Maine Technical College System and any
8	other Maine postsecondary education institution as long as the
	member maintains at least a 2.0 grade point average and serves in
10	the Maine National Guard for at least one year after the tuition
	assistance is granted. The tuition grant is given by the Maine
12	National Guard.
