An Act to Create the Alfred Water District.

(EMERGENCY)

Approved for introduction by a majority of the Legislative Council pursuant to Joint Rule 205.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted 2 as emergencies; and

Whereas, uninterrupted collection and distribution of water is essential to the health and welfare of inhabitants of the Town б of Alfred; and

Whereas, the formation of the water district is urgently needed to ensure that the collection and distribution of water is 10 not interrupted; and

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Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of 14 Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and 16 safety; now, therefore,

### Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

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Sec. 1. Territorial limits; corporate name. Pursuant to the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 35-A, chapter 64, that part of the Town 22 Beginning at the point of of Alfred described as follows: intersection of the Waterboro Road, which is also Route 202, and 24 Littlefield River, proceeding southeasterly along the the southern shore of the river to the intersection of the Biddeford 26 Road, thence diagonally southeasterly to the Kennebunk Road at the point of Tax Map 3, Lot 6 and Lot 7, thence southwesterly to 28 the intersection of Stone Road and the northern shore of Hay 30 Brook, thence southwesterly along the Alfred Town Line to the intersection of the Jordan Spring Road, thence due north to the intersection of the Mast Road and the Sanford Road, 32 thence diagonally in a northeasterly direction to the point of beginning; and its inhabitants constitute a standard district 34 under the name Alfred Water District, referred to in this Act as the "district." 36

Sec. 2. Powers; authority; duties. The district has all the 38 powers and authority and is subject to all the requirements and restrictions provided in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 35-A, 40 chapter 64.

Title 35-A, section 6403, subsection Pursuant to 2, paragraph D, Alfred Water District is authorized to take and use 44 water from any source of supply within the legal boundaries of the Town of Alfred. 46

Sec. 3. Number of trustees; gualifications. 48 The board of trustees of the district is composed of 3 trustees. A trustee must be a resident of the district and reside in a household to which the 50 district's service is provided.

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Sec. 4. Election of first board. The first board is elected in an election called by the municipal officers of the Town of Alfred within 6 months of approval of this Act by the voters in accordance with section 7.

6 Sec. 5. Terms of trustees. After the election of the first board, trustees are elected to 3-year terms in accordance with
 8 the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 35-A, section 6410, subsection 1.
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Sec. 6. Authorized to acquire property of Alfred Water Company. Pursuant to the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 35-A, section 6403, 12 subsection 2, paragraph C, the district, through its trustees, may acquire by purchase all or part of the plants, properties, 14 franchises, rights and privileges owned by the Alfred Water Company, including all lands, waters, water rights, reservoirs, 16 pipes, machinery, fixtures, hydrants and tools and all apparatus and appliances used or usable in supplying water in the area of 18 the district. The district may acquire by the exercise of the 20 right of eminent domain, a right expressly delegated to the district for that purpose, all or part of the plants, properties, 22 franchises, rights and privileges except cash assets and accounts receivable owned by the Alfred Water Company, including all lands, waters, water rights, dam structures, reservoirs, pipes, 24 machinery, fixtures, hydrants and tools and all apparatus and appliances used or usable in supplying water in the area of the 26 district, and if and when so acquired, the district, in addition to the powers conferred by this Act, may exercise all rights, 28 privileges and franchises of the Alfred Water Company.

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In exercising the right of eminent domain under this 32 section, the trustees shall file with the district clerk a condemnation order that includes a detailed description of the 34 property interests to be taken, the name or names of the owner or owners of record so far as they can be reasonably determined and 36 the amount of damages determined by the trustees to be just compensation for the property or interest taken. The trustees shall serve upon the owner or owners of record a copy of the 38 condemnation order and a check in the amount of damages awarded and record a certified copy of the condemnation order in the York 40 County Registry of Deeds. In the event of multiple ownership, the check may be served on any one of the owners. Title passes 42 to the district upon service of the order of condemnation and 44 check or upon recordation in accordance with this Act, whichever occurs first. Acceptance and negotiation of the check do not bar 46 an appeal under this Act.

48 Any person aggrieved by the determination of the damages awarded to owners of property or interest in the property under 50 this section may, within 60 days after service of the condemnation order and check, appeal to the Superior Court of York County. The court shall determine damages by a verdict of
its jury or, if all parties agree, by the court without a jury or
by a referee or referees and shall render judgment for just
compensation, with interest when interest is due, and for costs
in favor of the party entitled to costs. Appeal from the
decision of the Superior Court may be had to the Law Court as in
other civil actions.

Sec. 7. Emergency clause; referendum; effective date. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act takes effect when 10 approved only for the purpose of permitting its submission to the 12 legal voters within the territory described in section 1 of this Act at an election called for that purpose and held by December 31, 2000. The election must be called, advertised and conducted 14 according to the law relating to municipal elections, except that 16 the registrar of voters is not required to prepare or the clerk to post a new list of voters. For the purpose of registration of 18 voters, the registrar of voters must be in session the secular day preceding the election. The subject matter of this Act is reduced to the following question: 20

22 "Do you favor creating the Alfred Water District?"

24 The voters shall indicate by a cross or check mark placed against the word "Yes" or "No" their opinion of the same.

The results must be declared by the municipal officers of the Town of Alfred and due certificate of the results filed by the clerk with the Secretary of State.

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This Act takes effect for all purposes immediately upon its approval by a majority of the legal voters voting at the election. Failure to achieve the necessary approval in any referendum does not prohibit subsequent referenda consistent with this section, provided the referenda are held prior to July 1, 2001.

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#### **SUMMARY**

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This bill creates the Alfred Water District.
