After 2001, the commissioner shall establish an annual limit on the costs paid by the eligible persons for covered 8 prescriptions or nonprescription drugs or medications, after 10 which the program must pay 80% of the costs of all covered prescriptions or nonprescription drugs or medications. 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HOUSE AMENDMENT

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This amendment strikes that portion of the bill, as amended Committee Amendment "A," that establishes the 2 by Maine Prescription Drug Fair Pricing Act. This amendment instead 4 expands access to drugs and medicines under the elderly low-cost drug program through a benefit for generic drugs and a limit on out-of-pocket expenses in the supplemental component after which 6 the program will begin to pay 80% of the costs. This amendment 8 provides that balances in the elderly low-cost drug program do not lapse but carry forward to the next year. This amendment adds an allocation section to the bill. 10
