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## **SUMMARY**

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This amendment strikes that portion of the bill, as amended by Committee Amendment "A," that establishes the Maine Prescription Drug Fair Pricing Act. This amendment instead increases the eligibility for the basic component of the elderly low-cost drug program to persons at or below 300% of the federal poverty level, places a maximum on the out-of-pocket cost to those persons based on a sliding scale and expands access to drugs and medications through a benefit for generic drugs and a limit on out-of-pocket expenses in the supplemental component, after which the program will pay 80% of the costs.

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The amendment provides an allocation from the Fund for a Healthy Maine and requires balances in the elderly low-cost drug program to be carried forward.
