20	Act to Address Nonpoint Source Pollution from Certain Sources"
22	Amend the bill by striking out the title and substituting the following:
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26	'Resolve, to Require the Board of Environmental Protection and the Maine Land Use Regulation Commission to Adopt Consistent
28	Rules Regarding Cutting and Removal of Vegetation'
30	Further amend the bill by striking out everything after the title and before the summary and inserting in its place the
32	following:
34	'Sec. 1. Rules to regulate cutting and removal of vegetation in areas adjacent to rivers, streams, brooks, ponds, wetlands and tidal waters Resolved: That notwithstanding the Maine Revised Statutes, Title
36	38, chapter 3, subchapter I, articles 2-B and 5-A and in
38	accordance with the purposes of Title 12, chapter 206-A and Title 38, chapter 3, including the control of nonpoint source pollution, no later than January 2, 2002, the Board of
40	pollution, no later than January 2, 2002, the Board of Environmental Protection and the Department of Conservation, Maine Land Use Regulation Commission shall each provisionally
42	adopt rules in accordance with Title 5, chapter 375 to regulate the cutting and removal of vegetation, other than timber
44	harvesting activities, in areas adjacent to rivers, streams, brooks, ponds, wetlands and tidal waters.
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The Board of Environmental Protection and the Maine Land Use 2 Regulation Commission shall coordinate their rulemaking to adopt rules that resolve inconsistencies, where appropriate, among 4 standards established pursuant to the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 12, chapter 206-A and Title 38, chapter 3, subchapter I, articles 2-B and 5-A and retain standards established pursuant to 6 those statutes when those standards are consistent. Upon final 8 adoption, rules adopted by the board apply in the organized areas of the State and rules adopted by the commission apply in the unorganized and deorganized areas of the State. 10

12 Rules adopted pursuant to this section do not apply to timber harvesting activities, but the Board of Environmental 14 Protection and the Maine Land Use Regulation Commission shall consult with the Commissioner of Conservation to coordinate the 16 standards related to timber harvesting activities with the standards related to the cutting and removal of vegetation other 18 than timber harvesting.

Rules adopted pursuant to this section are major substantive rules as defined in Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter II-A and
must be provisionally adopted and submitted to the Legislature no later than January 2, 2002 for review; and be it further

Sec. 2. Legislation authorized. Resolved: That the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over 26 natural resources matters may report out a bill to the Second 28 Regular Session of the 120th Legislature to amend provisions in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 12, chapter 206-A administered 30 by the Department of Conservation, Maine Land Use Regulation Commission and in Title 38, chapter 3, subchapter 1, articles 2-B 32 5-A administered by the Department of Environmental and Protection to clarify the authority of these agencies to regulate 34 removal of vegetation and resolve the cutting or to inconsistencies between the rules adopted pursuant to section 1 36 and those statutes; and be it further

38 Sec. 3. Education initiative. Resolved: That after rules are adopted pursuant to section 1, the Department of Environmental 40 Protection and the Department of Conservation, Maine Land Use Regulation Commission and Bureau of Forestry shall jointly 42 develop and implement an educational initiative to inform the public in all areas of the State about the standards for the 44 cutting and removal of vegetation.'

- 46 Further amend the bill by inserting at the end before the summary the following:
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FISCAL NOTE

The Department of Environmental Protection and the Department of Conservation will incur some minor additional costs to administer certain regulatory responsibilities, to adopt certain rules and to implement an educational initiative. These costs can be absorbed within the departments' existing budgeted resources.

10 This bill may increase prosecutions for Class E crimes. If a jail sentence is imposed, the additional costs to the counties 12 are estimated to be \$83.36 per day per prisoner. The number of prosecutions that may result in a jail sentence and the resulting 14 costs to the county jail system are expected to be insignificant.

16 The additional workload and administrative costs associated with the minimal number of new cases filed in the court system 18 can be absorbed within the budgeted resources of the Judicial Department. The collection of additional fines may increase 20 General Fund revenue by minor amounts.'

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SUMMARY

26 This amendment replaces the bill and changes the title. The amendment directs the Board of Environmental Protection and the 28 Department of Conservation, Maine Land Use Regulation Commission to adopt rules to regulate the cutting and removal of vegetation, other than timber harvesting activities, in areas adjacent to 30 rivers, streams, ponds, wetlands and tidal waters. It requires 32 the rules to retain standards established under the laws related to mandatory shoreland zoning and natural resources protection The rules are major 34 when those standards are consistent. substantive rules and must be submitted to the Legislature for 36 review by January 2, 2002. The amendment does not affect current laws and rules, as amended, that regulate the cutting or removal 38 of vegetation prior to final adoption of the rules authorized by this amendment.

The amendment authorizes the joint standing committee of the 42 Legislature having jurisdiction over natural resources matters to report out a bill to the Second Regular Session of the 120th 44 Legislature to amend statutes administered by the Department of Environmental Protection and the Maine Land Use Regulation 46 Commission related to the cutting and removal of vegetation.

48 The amendment also requires the Department of Environmental Protection, the Maine Land Use Regulation Commission and the 50 Bureau of Forestry within the Department of Conservation to

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jointly develop and implement an educational initiative to inform the public in all areas of the State about the standards for the cutting and removal of vegetation.

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
