Removing the requirement that the Secretary of State collect a person's social security number may result in the State being out of conformity with federal law that requires the collection and use of social security numbers for use in child support enforcement. If another mechanism for the collection of social security numbers is not in effect, the State's Child Support Enforcement Program's approved State Plan may be jeopardized and, if disapproved, may result in the loss of approximately \$16,900,000 in federal funds to the Department of Human Services for the Child Support Enforcement Program and \$3,900,000 in federal funds for the Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) program beginning in fiscal year 2000-01. The Department of Human Services may request General Fund appropriations to offset the loss of the federal funds associated with the operation of the child support enforcement program.'

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SUMMARY

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This amendment is the majority report. This amendment removes the requirement that nondriver identification cards contain social security numbers. The amendment also removes the provision that allows the Secretary of State to suspend or revoke the driver's license of a person without a hearing for failing to provide a valid social security number. The provision is retained for commercial licenses.

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
