SENATE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 1869, L.D. 2605

Whereas, removing the requirement that a person provide that person's social security number on an application for a driver's license jeopardizes this federal funding; now, therefore, be it

Sec. 1. Waiver request. Resolved: That, by September 1, 2000, the Department of Human Services, Division of Support Enforcement and Recovery shall request a waiver from the United States Department of Health and Human Services of the requirement that a state plan for child support enforcement include the collection of a person's social security number on that person's application for a Maine driver's license.'

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FISCAL NOTE

SUMMARY

 16 The Department of Human Services will incur some minor additional costs to request a certain waiver. These costs can be
18 absorbed within the department's existing budgeted resources.

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Current federal law requires states to have in place a plan for child support enforcement; as part of the plan, the social security number of an applicant for a driver's license must be collected. Any state that fails to implement a plan for child support enforcement is subject to a loss of federal funding.

This amendment strikes the bill and replaces it with a 30 resolve that directs the Department of Human Services to request a waiver from the United States Department of Health and Human 32 Services of the requirement that a social security number be collected from an applicant for a driver's license. This request 34 must be submitted by September 1, 2000.
