COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 1873, L.D. 2610, Bill, "An Act to Provide Consumer Safety Certification for Snowmobiles and All-terrain Vehicles"

Amend the bill by striking out the title and substituting the following:

'An Act to Require Warranty Certification for Snowmobiles and All-terrain Vehicles'

Further amend the bill by striking out everything after the enacting clause and before the summary and inserting in its place the following:

'Sec. 1. 12 MRSA §7824, sub-§10, ¶D is enacted to read:

D. Prior to issuing a registration certificate for a new snowmobile, a snowmobile registration agent shall require that the registrant produce evidence that the registrant's name has been submitted to the manufacturer of the snowmobile for warranty coverage and to receive any product recalls and safety updates. For the purpose of this paragraph, the warranty registration form provided to the registrant by the selling dealer at the time of sale is sufficient evidence.

Sec. 2. 12 MRSA §7854, sub-§10, ¶C is enacted to read:

C. Prior to issuing a registration certificate for a new ATV, an ATV registration agent shall require that the registrant produce evidence that the registrant's name has

been submitted to the manufacturer of the ATV for warranty coverage and to receive any product recalls and safety updates. For the purpose of this paragraph, the warranty registration form provided to the registrant by the selling dealer at the time of sale is sufficient evidence.'

SUMMARY

This amendment replaces the original bill. It requires that a person who registers a new snowmobile or ATV provide proof that the vehicle has been registered with the manufacturer of the snowmobile or ATV for warranty protection and safety or recall notices.
