30	This bill requires the Maine Science and Technology Foundation to prepare an initial evaluation of state investments in research and development by July 1, 2001 and changes the date
32	for each subsequent 5-year evaluation from the first day of each legislative session to July 1st. The bill also requires
34	recipients of state research and development funding to submit certain information on the research and development activity to
36	the Maine Science and Technology Foundation in order to assist the foundation in preparing the comprehensive evaluation.
38	Finally, the bill appropriates \$145,000 in fiscal year 2000-01 to the Maine Science and Technology Foundation for preparation of
40	the initial research and development evaluation.
