_	Whereas, funds were earmarked for the Eagle Island ferry
6	service in Private and Special Law 1999, chapter 25; and
8	Whereas, although the effective date of Private and Special
	Law 1999, chapter 25 was May 21, 1999, the Hancock County
10	Commissioners have refused to pass these funds on to the ferry service; and

	Whereas, waiting until 90 days after adjournment of the
14	Second Regular Session of the 119th Legislature would place an inequitable and unwarranted burden on the ferry service; and

	Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts
18	create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately
20	necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,
