**Emergency** preamble. Whereas, Acts and resolves of the do not become effective until 2 Legislature 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and 4 Whereas, domestic violence is a pervasive and atrocious problem in Maine and nationwide; and 6 8 Whereas, for the health and well-being of the people of Maine, it is imperative that reasonable and sound measures be taken to alleviate the problem of domestic violence; and 10 Whereas, in order to adequately address the problem of 12 domestic violence, it needs to be determined what the issues and problems are and what reasonable and sound measures need to be 14 taken; and 16 Whereas, this determination needs to be undertaken as soon as possible so that the problem of domestic violence may be 18 alleviated quickly; and 20 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of 22 Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and 24 safety; now, therefore, be it 26 Sec. 1. Commission established. Resolved: That the Commission to Study Domestic Violence, referred to in this resolve as the 28 "commission," is established; and be it further 30 Sec. 2. Commission membership. Resolved: That the commission 32 consists of the following members: One member of the Senate who sits on the Joint Standing 1. 34 Committee on Criminal Justice, appointed by the President of the 36 Senate: 38 2. Two members of the House of Representatives who sit on the Joint Standing Committee on Criminal Justice, appointed by the Speaker of the House; 40 One member of the Maine Association of Clerks of Courts, 42 3. selected by that association; 44 4. One member of the Maine Sheriffs Association, selected 46 by that association; One member of the Maine Chiefs of Police Association, 48 5. selected by that association;

The President of the Maine Association of Criminal 2 6. Defense Lawyers, or the president's designee; 4 The President of the Maine Prosecutors Association, or 7. б the president's designee; 8. The Director of the Maine Coalition to End Domestic 8 Violence, or the director's designee; 10 9. The Director of Violence No More, or the director's 12 designee; 14 10. The Chair of the Maine Commission on Domestic Abuse, or the chair's designee; 16 The Victims Service Coordinator for the Department of 11. 18 Corrections; 20 12. One representative of Parents of Murdered Children, Maine Chapter, appointed by the Maine chapter leader; 22 One member of the Department of Corrections, Division 13. 24 Probation and Parole, appointed by the Commissioner of of Corrections; 26 14. The Commissioner of Public Safety, or the 28 commissioner's designee, who serves as an ex officio, nonvoting member; and 30 15. Attorney General or the Attorney General's The 32 designee, who serves as an ex officio, nonvoting member. 34 The commission shall ask the Chief Justice of the Supreme Judicial Court to designate a judge or retired judge from the District Court to serve on the commission as a voting member and 36 shall the State Administrator, request Court or the administrator's designee, to serve on the commission as a 38 nonvoting member; and be it further 40 Sec. 3. Chairs. Resolved: That the first named Senate member is the Senate chair of the commission and the first named House 42 of Representatives member is the House chair of the commission; and be it further 44 Sec. **Appointments:** meetings. 46 4. **Resolved:** That all appointments must be made no later than 30 days following the 48 effective date of this resolve. The appointing authorities shall notify the Executive Director of the Legislative Council upon 50 making their appointments. When the appointment of all members

is complete, the chairs of the commission shall call and convene
the first meeting of the commission no later than 30 days after all appointments have been made. The commission may hold up to 8
meetings; and be it further

6 Sec. 5. Duties. Resolved: That the commission shall invite the participation of experts and interested parties, gather 8 information and request necessary data from public and private entities in order to study the problem of domestic violence and 10 determine methods of alleviating this problem, including, but not limited to:

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Strengthening protection from abuse orders, including
 improving communication between the courts, law enforcement and other appropriate government agencies regarding notice and
 verification of protection from abuse orders;

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2. Increasing enforcement of probation and bail conditions;

 Increasing education in elementary and secondary schools to heighten awareness of domestic violence;

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 Examining the handling of all aspects of domestic
 violence cases from investigation to prosecution to movement through the court system; and

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5. Examining sentencing practices; and be it further

Sec. 6. Staff assistance. Resolved: That, upon approval of the Legislative Council, the Office of Policy and Legal Analysis shall provide necessary staffing services to the commission. If requested by the commission, the Department of Public Safety, the Department of Corrections and the Office of the Attorney General also shall provide assistance; and be it further

36 Sec. 7. Compensation. Resolved: That the members of the commission who are Legislators are entitled to the legislative 38 per diem, as defined in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 3, section 2, and reimbursement for necessary expenses incurred for 40 their attendance at authorized meetings of the commission. Other members of the commission who are not otherwise compensated by 42 their employers or other entities that they represent are entitled to receive reimbursement of necessary expenses incurred 44 for their attendance at authorized meetings; and be it further

46 Sec. 8. Report. Resolved: That the commission shall submit its report, together with any necessary implementing legislation,
48 to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over criminal justice matters no later than

2001. 5, The joint standing committee of December the 2 Legislature having jurisdiction over criminal justice matters may introduce a bill during the Second Regular Session of the 120th If the commission requires a limited extension of 4 Legislature. time to conclude its work, it may apply to the Legislative 6 Council, which may grant the extension; and be it further

Sec. 9. Budget. Resolved: That the chairs of the commission, 8 with assistance from the commission staff, shall administer the commission's budget. Within 10 days after its first meeting, the 10 commission shall present a work plan and proposed budget to the 12 Legislative Council for approval. The commission may not incur expenses that would result in the commission exceeding its 14 approved budget. Upon request from the commission, the Executive Director of the Legislative Council shall promptly provide the 16 commission chairs and staff with a status report on the commission's budget, expenditures incurred and paid and available 18 funds; and be it further

20 Sec. 10. Appropriation. Resolved: That the following funds are appropriated from the General Fund to carry out the purposes of this resolve.

	consideration in the Second Regular Session of the 120th
16	Legislature.
