24	Amend the bill in section 1 in paragraph F in the first line (page 1, line 5 in L.D.) by striking out the following
26	"January" and inserting in its place the following: 'February'
28	Further amend the bill in section 2 in the last line (page 1, line 13 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "January" and
30	inserting in its place the following: 'February'
32	Further amend the bill by inserting at the end before the summary the following:

38	The Workers' Compensation Board and the state employees workers' compensation program may realize some minor savings from not having to pay benefits to an injured worker in this state who
40	is a resident of a foreign country, province or state if those entities do not pay benefits to Maine residents working in that
42	country. These savings are not expected to affect the amount budgeted by state departments and agencies for workers
44	compensation.'
46	SUMMARY
48	This amendment delays the application date of the law that
50	exempts foreign residents working in the State from coverage under the State's workers' compensation laws if state residents
52	working in that person's country, province or state of residence are not protected by the workers' compensation laws there.
