An Act to Amend the Laws Regarding the Board of Licensure of Water Treatment Plant Operators.

Reported by Senator PARADIS of Aroostook for the Joint Standing Committee on Health and Human Services pursuant to Joint Order S.P. 1033.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

SUMMARY

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	This bill amends the laws regarding the Board of Licensure
4	of Water Treatment Plant Operators. It does the following:
6	1. Modifies the definition of "operator" to coincide with
	the federal definition;
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	2. Clarifies the classification requirements to apply to
10	all community public water systems and all noncommunity
	nontransient water systems;
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	3. Increases the membership on the Board of Licensure of
14	Water Treatment Plant Operators from 7 to 9, in order to provide
	representation to the new classes of supply that are required to
16	have licensed operators;
18	4. Authorizes the board to suspend or revoke a license of a
	certified operator;
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	5. Repeals the provision that grandfathered operators who
22	operated between October 1, 1966 and October 1, 1969; and

6. Repeals the provision that authorized a 13-month waiver provision to allow an applicant time to pass an annual exam.
