SUMMARY

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This amendment amends the resolve by providing that the rules for adult day services, Alzheimer's respite, congregate housing services, the homemaker program, home-based care for elders and adults with disabilities and consumer-directed home-based care programs require that consumers who may qualify for a waiver be informed of the right to apply for a waiver. The amendment also provides that the rules for in-home and community support services and personal care assistance for severely physically disabled adults refer to determination of the dependent allowance in agreement with the method used in the Medicaid program. The amendment also adds a fiscal note.
