## An Act to Establish Guidelines for High School Sports.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
Sec. 1. 20-A MRSA c. 224 is enacted to read:
CHAPTER 224
EXTRACURRICULAR ATHLETICS
6751. Guidelines for secondary school sports
1. Guidelines. A school administrative unit shall
stablish guidelines that allow a student athlete in a public
econdary school to:
A. Participate in any sport, year round;
ne rarazozpate in any oporter year roundr
B. Be coached year round by that student's high school
coach, other school coaches and volunteer coaches;
C. Use public school sports facilities and equipment, year
round, as scheduling permits, with priority given to sports
teams currently in their regular season; and
D. Participate in clinics, training and competitions
outside the school system, with or without the assistance of
school coaches.

2. Limitations. A school administrative unit may not
equire a student to participate in any of the activities
escribed in subsection 1 in order to play a sport during the
egular school season for that sport.
SUMMARY
5 UMMAAN A
This bill requires all school administrative units to allow
tudent athletes and coaches to participate in sports-related
ctivities at any time throughout the year. It also prohibits
chool administrative units from requiring student athletes to
articipate in sports outside the regular season in order to
articipate during the regular season.
