24	Amend the resolution by striking out the title and substituting the following:
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28	'RESOLUTION, Proposing an Amendment to the Constitution of Maine to Increase from 2/3 to 3/4 the Majority Vote that the Legislature Needs to Pass Legislation Imposing Mandates on Local

32	Further amend the resolution in section 21 in the 8th to 11th lines (page 1, lines 14 to 17 in L.D.) by striking out the
34	following: "Legislation-implementing-this-section-or-requiring-a specific-expenditure-as-an-exception-to-this-requirement-may-be
36	enacted-upon-the-vote-of-2/3-of-all-members- cleated-to -each HouseThis-section-must-be-liberally-construed-" and inserting
38	in its place the following: 'Legislation implementing this
40	section or requiring a specific expenditure as an exception to this requirement may be enacted upon the vote of 2/3 <u>3/4</u> of all members elected to each House. This section must be liberally

44	Further amend the resolution by striking out all of the question (page 1, lines 31 to 34 in L.D.) and inserting in its

COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "/ " to H.P. 52, L.D. 61

Further amend the resolution by inserting at the end before 2 the summary the following:

'FISCAL NOTE

6 The estimated cost of sending this constitutional amendment out to referendum will vary according to the total number of referenda enacted during the First Regular Session of the 120th Legislature to be submitted to the voters in November. The estimated cost to the Secretary of State if one to 6 referenda are enacted is \$121,392. Each additional referendum costs an additional \$8,000.

14 If approved by the voters, this constitutional amendment may affect future legislation that proposes to enact state mandates. 16 Additional proposals may require funding for 90% of any costs as a result of the higher number of votes required to exempt a 18 proposed state mandate from the funding requirements.'

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SUMMARY

This amendment, which is the minority report, proposes to 24 amend the original resolution by retaining the current language in the Constitution of Maine, Article IX, Section 21 with the 26 exception of the requirement that a 2/3 majority of the Legislature vote to impose mandates on local units of government. The amendment strikes the 2/3 majority and replaces 28 it with a 3/4 majority. The amendment also changes the proposed 30 referendum question to reflect this change and to refer to local units of government instead of municipalities.

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
