An Act Regarding the Use of Lights and Sirens on Personal Vehicles Used by Volunteer Firefighters and EMS Personnel.

emergency medical service vehicle, a fire department vehicle, a fire vehicle or a hazardous material response vehicle must emit a red light or a combination of red and white light. 6 8 The municipal officers or a municipal official designated by the municipal officers, with the approval 10 of the fire chief, may authorize an active member of a municipal or volunteer fire department to use a 12 flashing-red-signal--light-net-more-than-5-inches-in diameter siren and any combination of flashing red, 14 white and amber lights on a vehicle. The light lights and siren may be displayed but may be used only while the member is en route to or at the scene of a fire or 16 other emergency. exercising the privilege of using a light and siren.

The privilege of using a light or siren may be revoked at any time for misconduct by a municipal officer or a municipal official designated by the municipal officers, with the approval of the fire chief or the chief official of the emergency medical service.

SUMMARY

This bill permits municipal and volunteer firefighters and emergency medical services personnel to use a siren and flashing red, white and amber lights on a personal vehicle while en route to or at the scene of a fire or other emergency. It also provides that such vehicles are covered by the rules of operation applying to authorized emergency vehicles. The bill also adds requirements that must be met before a person may use a siren and flashing light on a personal vehicle.
