An Act to Establish the Washington County Emergency Medical Services Authority.

Whereas,** Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

6 Whereas, Washington County is currently without emergency 6 medical services; and

8 Whereas, this situation places the entire population of that county at enormous risk; and

Whereas, it is imperative that this situation be rectified 12 immediately; and

Whereas, in order to secure emergency medical services for
Washington County it is necessary to create a quasi-municipal
corporation to provide such services; and

18 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of 20 Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and 22 safety; now, therefore,

24 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

26 Sec. 1. Establishment. The Washington County Emergency Medical Services Authority, referred to in this Act as "the 28 authority," is established to facilitate the provision of emergency medical services to the citizens of Washington County.

Sec. 2. Board of directors. The authority is governed by a board of directors, referred to in this Act as "the board." The board consists of: 34

1. One member appointed by the Washington County 36 Commissioners to represent the unorganized territories; and

38 2. One member from:

22	The members of the board are appointed for terms of one year and may be reappointed at the pleasure of the appointing				
24	authority.				
26	Sec. 3. Powers. The authority may:				
28	1. Employ and compensate personnel, consultants, technical and professional assistants and an emergency medical services				
30	medical director;				
32	2. Make and enter into contracts and agreements;				
34	3. Hold public hearings and sponsor public forums;				
36	4. Sue and be sued in its own name;				
38	5. Accept funds, grants and services from federal, state, county and municipal governments or any agency thereof, gifts and				
40	stipends from its member towns, private gifts from entities and foundations and stipends and subsidies from Canadian governments				
42	for the provision of services to Campobello Island and the Province of New Brunswick; and				
44	6. Allocate and disburse funds received to promote the				
46	authority.				
48	Sec. 4. Duties. The authority shall:				
50	1. Prepare an annual budget;				

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2 2. Follow uniform standards provided in Maine statutes insofar as they relate to Department of Public Safety rules; 4 з. Make provisions for emergency medical services in the 6 county on a contract basis where new services are to be provided; however, where emergency medical services are already provided by 8 existing services, they are not abolished by this Act without the express consent of the governing body of the area and vote of the 10 existing medical services' board; 12 Implement a county-wide subscription membership program 4. unless otherwise prohibited by law; and 14 Set and adjust an approved cost-basis schedule that is 5. 16 uniform throughout the county. 18 Sec. 5. Organization; conduct of business; meetings. The board be organized and its business must be conducted in must 20 accordance with the following: 22 The board shall elect a chair, vice-chair, secretary and 1. treasurer from among its members. 24 The secretary shall keep a record of the board's 2. meetings. These records are public records. 26 28 3. The treasurer shall keep records of the board's transactions. These records are public records. 30 4. The treasurer must be bonded in an amount to be determined by the board. 32 34 5. A quorum of the board is 6 members and must include the chair or vice-chair and the secretary or treasurer of the board. 36 6. The board shall adopt such bylaws and mission statements 38 as are necessary for the legal operation and proper management of the authority. 40 Sec. 6. Meetings. The bylaws shall establish the annual meeting of the board. Additional meetings may be scheduled at 42 the call of the chair or at the written request of any 5 members of the board. 44 46 A member who fails to attend board meetings 5 consecutive times may be replaced by the appointing authority. Notification of such absences from the secretary of the board to the 48 appointing authority is sufficient to trigger the appointment of 50 a replacement board member by the appointing authority.
