22	Amend the bill by striking out the title and substituting
24	the following:
26	'An Act Concerning Commercial Shooting Areas'
28	Further amend the bill by inserting after the title and before the enacting clause the following:
30	'Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted
32	as emergencies; and
34	Whereas, banding of game birds used in commercial shooting areas and used by game bird suppliers no longer serves an
36	important purpose in managing the State's natural resources; and
38	Whereas, Hungarian partridge are highly sought after as a game species by the patrons of commercial shooting areas and
40	appear to pose no threat of establishing a viable wild population outside of commercial shooting areas; and
42	Whereas, the current commercial shooting fee structure
44	Whereas, the current commercial shooting fee structure imposes an undesirable burden on the patrons of commercial shooting areas; and

48	Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of

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Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and
safety; now, therefore,'

7105-A. License to operate a commercial shooting area

1. Issuance. The commissioner may issue licenses authorizing the establishment and operation of commercial
shooting areas to qualified applicants. A commercial shooting
area license authorizes the owner of a commercial shooting area
to charge others for the opportunity to hunt mallard ducks,
pheasants, quail, Chukar partridge and Hungarian partridge in
that area. A commercial shooting area license is valid for one year and is renewable annually.
2. Eligibility. In order to qualify for a commercial shooting area license:
A. The location of the land may not be within 5 miles from
another commercial shooting area, as measured by a straight
line between the property lines at their closest points to each other;
B. The land may not be less than 200 acres nor more than 400 acres in area;

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C. The land must be contiguous. Property bisected by a road or highway is considered to be contiguous for purposes

2	D. The land must be owned or leased by the licensed operator of the commercial shooting area.

6	A new shooting area license may not be issued within 6 months of the expiration of the license for another shooting area located
8	within 5 miles unless the holder of the expired license states in writing to the commissioner that the license will be abandoned.
10	A renewal of a shooting area license may be issued for a commercial shooting area within 5 miles of another commercial
12	shooting area, notwithstanding paragraph A, as long as the renewed license is applied for within 6 months following the
14	expiration of the old license.
16	3. Fees. The fee for a commercial shooting area license issued after January 1, 2002 is:
18	A. For the first year of operation, \$500; and
20	B. For each subsequent year, \$250, payable prior to July
22	1st of each year.
24 26	4. Requirements. The following requirements apply to a commercial shooting area.
28	A. The operator of the commercial shooting area shall maintain and keep open to inspection by representatives of the department a register of:
30	(1) The name and address of each person shooting in the area;
34	(2) The date or dates when that person hunted in the area; and
36	(3) The number and type of birds killed by that person.
38	B. The operator of the commercial shooting area shall
40	provide to each person taking birds in that area a receipted invoice or bill of sale for possession and transportation of
42	those birds.
44	C. The operator of the commercial shooting area shall mark the boundary of the shooting area in a manner prescribed by
46	the commissioner and shall post the boundary conspicuously with signs or other markings approved by the commissioner.
48	The signs or markings must be of a color, size and wording prescribed by the commissioner and must be placed not more
50	than 250 feet apart facing the outside of the area.

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- 5. Enforcement. Enforcement of the trespass laws of a commercial shooting area is the responsibility of the owner and may not in any manner be considered an obligation of the department. 6. Exceptions. The following exceptions apply to a 6 commercial shooting area. 8 A. Notwithstanding subsection 1, the operator of a commercial shooting area may authorize a person to hunt 10 other wild birds or wild animals in a commercial shooting area during the regular open season on those species, in 12 accordance with the provisions of chapters 701 to 721, as 14 long as the person possesses a valid state hunting license that allows the hunting of those wild birds and wild animals. 16 B. Commercial shooting areas and game bird suppliers are exempt from the requirements of section 7235-A, subsection 18 3, paragraph A. 20 Sec. 5. 12 MRSA §7239, as amended by PL 1983, c. 440, §9, is further amended to read: 22 Importation permit for mallard ducks, quail, Chukar 24 partridge and Hungarian partridge 26 Issuance. The commissioner may grant permits to import live mallard ducks, quail and, Chukar partridge and Hungarian 28 partridge to operators of commercial shooting areas. 30 Application. 32	SUMMARY
34	This amendment strikes the bill and does the following:
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38	 It removes the requirement that game birds used by commercial shooting areas and game bird suppliers have leg bands;
40	2. It authorizes the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife to allow commercial shooting areas to stock Hungarian
42	partridge;
44	3. It requires a commercial shooting area to provide each person taking birds in that area a receipted invoice or bill of
46	sale for possession and transportation of those birds;
48	4. It provides that the distance between commercial shooting areas must be measured between the property lines at

- their closest points to each other and that a new license can not be issued to a new shooting area prior to 6 months after the expiration of a license possessed by an existing shooting area that is within 5 miles of the new shooting area unless the holder of the expired license states in writing to the commissioner that the license will be abandoned;
- 8 5. It allows the renewal of a shooting area license if applied for within 6 months of the expiration of the old license;

- 6. It increases the fee for commercial shooting area licenses from \$333 to \$500 for the first year and from \$133 to \$250 for every year thereafter; and
 - 7. It adds a fiscal note to the bill.

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
