Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

	Sec. 1. 12 MRSA §7105, sub-§5 is enacted to read:

	5. Residents over 70 years of age. The commissioner may
6	issue a free special commercial shooting area hunting license to
	any resident of the State who is 70 years of age or older upon
8	application to the commissioner. These complimentary licenses,
	upon issuance, remain valid for the remainder of the life of a
10	license holder, provided the license holder continues to satisfy
	the residency requirements set out in section 7001, subsection 32
12	and provided the license is not revoked or suspended. A resident
	who applies for a complimentary license at any time during the
14	calendar year of that resident's 70th birthday must be issued a
	license upon application, regardless of the actual date during
16	<u>that calendar year in which that resident attains 70 years of</u>
	age. The application must be accompanied by a birth certificate
18	or other certified evidence of the applicant's date of birth and
	<u>residency. When the holder of a license issued under this</u>
20	subsection no longer satisfies the residency requirements set out
	in section 7001, subsection 32, the license is no longer valid
22	and further use of the license for purposes of hunting in a
	commercial shooting area constitutes a license violation under
24	section 7371, subsection 3.

	This bill allows the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and
