	1. Started secondary school. Started secondary school

	2. Inducted into Armed Forces. Was inducted into the Armed
	Forces of the United States between September 16, 1940 and
	December 31, 1946;
	3. Scheduled to graduate from secondary school. Had been
j	scheduled to graduate from secondary school between 1941 and
	1950; and
	4. Honorably discharged. Received an honorable discharge
	from the Armed Forces of the United States.

	This bill permits a secondary school to award a diploma to a
	veteran whose secondary school education was interrupted by
	service in the Armed Forces of the United States during World War
