This amendment requires the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife to review its animal damage control program, in consultation with the department's regional coyote snaring steering committees, focusing on the deployment of trappers to snare coyotes in deer yards during winter months. The department shall report back its findings and proposed plans to implement those findings to the Joint Standing Committee on Inland Fisheries and Wildlife by October 1, 2001. The department shall implement its proposed plans during the 2001-02 winter in areas where predation by coyotes poses a threat to deer. The amendment also adds a fiscal note to the bill.
