	This amendment transfers \$570,000 in fiscal year 2001-02
40	from the Maine Solid Waste Management Fund to the Tire Management Fund. The amendment also transfers in the next fiscal year 50% of
42	the surplus in the Maine Solid Waste Management Fund to the Tire Management Fund. Those transferred funds must be used for tire
44	stockpile abatement, remediation and cleanup.
46	The amendment also directs the Commissioner of Environmental Protection and the Director of the State Planning Office to
