This amendment amends the original bill by mandating, for a 2nd or subsequent offense, the suspension of a minor's driver's license who is guilty of presenting or offering fraudulent identification to obtain liquor or to enter a licensed premises where minors are not allowed. The amendment maintains the provision in the original bill that grants the court discretion to suspend a driver's license for an initial offense.
