Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows: 2 Sec. 1. 5 MRSA §17760, sub-§2, as amended by PL 1991, c. 479, 4  $\S3$ , is further amended to read: 6 Service before becoming a member. A member who served as 2. a full-time active duty member of the armed forces before becoming a member of the retirement system is entitled to service 8 credit for the period of time he the member served in the armed 10 forces, under the following terms and conditions. 12 Α. On the date of retirement, the member must have at least 15 5 years of creditable service. 14 C. The member must have separated from the armed forces 16 under conditions other than dishonorable, providing that the separation was not upgraded through a program of general 18 amnesty. 20 D. -- Except-as -provided -in -paragraph-E7-the -member -must -have begun-membership-before-January-1,-1976. 22 E.---A-member--who--served--in-the--armed-forces-during-any federally-recognized-period-of-conflict,--ac-defined-in-Title 24 37-B,-section-504,-subsection-4,-paragraph-A-1,-subparagraph 26 (3),-is-entitled-to-service-credit-under-this-subsection.  (2) Who are disabled by injury or disease incurred or aggravated during active military service in the line of duty and are receiving any form of pension or compensation from the United States Government for total, service-connected disability.

The exemptions provided in this paragraph apply to the property of that veteran, including property held in joint tenancy with that veteran's spouse or held in a revocable living trust for the benefit of that veteran.

Exemptions granted under this paragraph on or after April 1, 2002 require a 100% reimbursement to the municipality for the property tax revenues lost to that municipality. Exemptions granted on or after April 1, 2002 under this paragraph are not considered eligible for reimbursement under paragraph H. Municipal property tax revenues lost as a result of exemptions granted prior to April 1, 2002 are not 100% reimbursable but may be reimbursable under section 661.

## SUMMARY

2 This bill reduces from 15 to 5 the years of creditable service a state employee who is a member of the Maine State 4 Retirement System must have before the employee is eligible to 6 purchase service credits for service in the Armed Forces of the United States. It also removes the requirement that members 8 joining after January 1, 1976 must have served in a federally recognized period of conflict to be eligible to purchase military 10 service credits. This bill expands eligibility for the veterans' property tax 12 exemption and removes from statute eligibility requirements related to federally recognized periods of war. It also makes 14 all honorably discharged veterans who are 62 years of age or 16 eliqible for the veterans' property tax exemption older authorized by this bill. The bill requires the Department of Administrative and Financial Services, Maine Revenue Services to 18 notify each municipality of this expanded eligibility at least 60 20 days prior to the beginning of the first property tax year to which this expanded eligibility applies. 22 This bill designates as public assistance aid provided to veterans and their dependents pursuant to the Maine Revised 24 Statutes, Title 37-B and requires that the Department of Defense, and Emergency Management retain administrative 26 Veterans responsibility for this aid. 28 This bill also restores funding for support staff positions 30 in the Department of Defense, Veterans and Emergency Management, Bureau of Veterans' Services regional field offices that were eliminated in the budget cuts of 1990. It provides funding to 32

purchase new computers and software for the regional offices that will, among other things, link them with the bureau's Togus claims office. The bill also restores funding to provide aid to veterans and their dependents.
