	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2	Sec.1. 20-A MRSA §4722-A is enacted to read:
4 6	§4722-A. High school diploma standards for World War II veterans
8	Notwithstanding section 4722, a secondary school may award a high school diploma to a person who is a resident of a municipality served by that secondary school or who attended that
10	secondary school if that person:
12	1. Started secondary school. Started secondary school between 1937 and 1946;
14	2. Served in Armed Forces. Left secondary school to serve
16	in the Armed Forces of the United States between September 16, 1940 and December 31, 1946;
18	
20	3. Did not receive high school diploma. Did not receive a high school diploma as a consequence of service in the Armed Forces of the United States; and
22	
24	 Honorably discharged. Received an honorable discharge from the Armed Forces of the United States.
26	A secondary school may award a high school diploma posthumously.

30	SUMMARY
32	This bill permits a secondary school to award a diploma to a person who started secondary school between 1937 and 1946, left
34	secondary school to serve in the Armed Forces of the United States, did not receive a diploma as a consequence of this
36	service and received an honorable discharge.
