Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted 2 as emergencies; and 4 Whereas, first responders are usually the first emergency б medical services persons to arrive at the scene of an emergency in rural areas; and 8 Whereas, first responders currently do not carry bee sting 10 kits; and 12 Whereas, first responders are not trained to administer epinephrine; and 14 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts 16 create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately 18 necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, 20 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows: 22 Sec. 1. Appropriation. The following funds are appropriated from the General Fund to carry out the purposes of this Act. 24 2002-03 2001-02 26 **PUBLIC SAFETY, DEPARTMENT OF** 28 30 **Emergency Medical Services** All Other \$15,535 \$12,810 32 34 Provides funds to purchase bee sting kits for first 36 responders and to provide the necessary training to administer epinephrine. 38 40 Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act takes effect when approved. 42 SUMMARY 44 This bill provides a General Fund appropriation of \$15,535 in fiscal year 2001-02 and \$12,810 in fiscal year 2002-03 for the 46 Department of Public Safety to purchase bee sting kits for first responders and to provide the necessary training to administer 48 epinephrine.
