24	Amend the bill by striking out everything after the enacting clause and before the summary and inserting in its place the following:
26	' Sec. 1. 20-A MRSA §4706, as amended by PL 1991, c. 655, §4,
28	is further amended to read:
30	§4706. Instruction in American history, Maine studies and Maine Native American history
32	The following subjects shall-be are required.
34	
36	1. American history. American history and civil government, including the Constitution of the United States, the Declaration of Independence, the importance of voting and the privileges and
38	responsibilities of citizenship, shall <u>must</u> be taught in and required for graduation from all elementary and secondary
40	schools, both public and private.
42	2. Maine studies. A-course-in Maine history, including the Constitution of Maine, Maine geography and environment and the
44	natural, industrial and economic resources of Maine and Maine's cultural and ethnic heritage, must be taught in-at-leastone
46	grade-from-grade-6-to-grade-8,-in-all-schools,-both-public-and private. These-concepts-must-be-integrated-into-the-curriculum
48	in-grades -9-to-12. A required component of Maine studies is Maine Native American studies addressing the following topics:

The Maine Native American History and Culture Commission, 14 referred to in this section as the "commission," is established to help prepare for the inclusion of Maine Native American 16 history and culture into the required course in Maine studies as specified in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 20-A, section 18 4706, subsection 2. 20 1. Membership. The commission consists of the following 15 members: 22 24 Eight members selected by the tribal chiefs Α. and governors of the Passamaquoddy Tribe, the Penobscot Nation, 26 the Houlton Band of Maliseet Indians and the Aroostook Band of Micmacs. At least one of these members must be appointed to serve from the Maine Indian Tribal-State Commission; 28 Six members selected by the Commissioner of Education, 30 в. including an elementary school teacher, a middle school 32 teacher, a high school teacher, a curriculum director, a principal employee superintendent or and an of the Department of Education; and 34 36 C. C. Involve other knowledgeable organizations and individuals able and willing to assist with this work, including, but not limited to, museums and educators.

3. Convening the commission. No later than 30 days following the effective date of this Act, the Maine Indian Tribal-State Commission shall call and convene the first meeting of the commission and preside over the selection of a chair.

10 4. Reporting. The commission shall report its findings to the Commissioner of Education for implementation and shall provide a copy to the Maine Indian Tribal-State Commission, regarding:

A. Educational materials that are appropriate to assist school administrative units and educators in the State to include Maine Native American history and culture into the required course in Maine studies; and

20 в. Opportunities for professional development, training and technical assistance that must be provided to assist school 22 educators administrative units and in the State in implementing Maine Native American history and culture into 24 the required course in Maine studies.

26 Staff assistance and resources. The Maine Indian 5. Tribal-State Commission shall provide staffing assistance to the Each entity appointing members to the commission 28 commission. shall reimburse its appointees to the commission for travel costs associated with participation in commission meetings and other 30 activities of the commission. Each entity shall assist in identifying and securing resources to enhance the work of the 32 commission. 34

6. Implementation. The commission shall provide a
36 preliminary report to the Commissioner of Education for dissemination to educators in the State by June 1, 2002 and a
38 final report by September 1, 2003.

40 Sec. 3. Report must include plan to assist school administrative units. The recommendations of the Maine Native American History and Culture Commission must include a plan to assist the 42 Department of Education in helping school administrative units implement instruction in Maine Native American studies. The plan 44 must also include criteria to identify school administrative units having difficulty meeting the instructional components of 46 Maine Native American studies and the provision of assistance to these school administrative units. The plan for assistance must 48 be established by July 30, 2004 and implemented during the 50 2004-2005 school year.

Sec. 4. School to implement Maine Native American studies subject 2 to availability of funds. Following review of the recommendations of the Maine Native American History and Culture Commission, school 4 administrative units may not be required to take any action that necessitates additional expenditures from local revenues unless 6 the Department of Education pays for 90% of the additional Implementation of instruction in Maine Native American costs. 8 studies is at the discretion of the school administrative unit if additional local expenditures are required for implementation and 10 the department has not paid its share of the additional local costs.

- A school administrative unit that determines that it is unable to implement instruction in Maine Native American studies 14 within existing state and local resources shall present its findings and supporting evidence to the Department of Education. 16 The department shall review the findings and evidence and, if 18necessary, assist the unit in planning for implementation.'

'FISCAL NOTE

The requirements that local school administrative units must teach Maine Native American history and culture in all elementary 26 and secondary schools in Maine and shall present their findings 28 and supporting evidence to the Department of Education if such units determine they are unable to implement instruction in Maine Native American studies within existing state and local resources 30 represents a state mandate pursuant to the Constitution of The additional costs are indeterminate at this time. 32 Maine. Unless General Fund appropriations are provided to fund at least 34 90% of the additional costs or a Mandate Preamble is amended to the bill and two-thirds of the members of each House vote to 36 exempt this mandate from the funding requirement, the local school administrative units may not be required to implement this 38 change.

The additional costs associated with convening the Maine 40 Native American History and Culture Commission can be absorbed by 42 the Maine Indian Tribal-State Commission utilizing existing budgeted resources.

The additional costs associated with reviewing certain findings and evidence and assisting local school administrative 46 units with planning for implementation of certain studies can be absorbed by the Department of Education utilizing existing 48 budgeted resources.'

COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "H" to H.P. 255, L.D. 291

SUMMARY

This amendment requires that Maine Native American history and culture be taught in all elementary and secondary schools. The amendment also establishes a study commission to identify and explore available materials and resources for Maine educators to use in implementing these instructional areas. The amendment authorizes the Maine Indian Tribal-State Commission to carry out the study commission.

study commission The amendment further requires the 14 recommendations to include a plan to assist the Department of Education in helping school administrative units implement 16 instruction in Maine Native American studies. The plan for assistance must be established by July 30, 2004 and implemented during the 2004-2005 school year. Finally, the amendment allows 18 administrative unit to delay implementation of а school 20 instruction in Maine Native American studies if implementation of the component topics can not be achieved within existing local resources and requires the Department of Education to develop a 22 reporting mechanism that permits a school administrative unit to report such a delay to the department at no cost to the unit. 24
