Sec. 1. Authorization of study of the governance and administrative 8 structure of the State's workers' compensation system. Resolved: That the Department of Administrative and Financial Services shall administer a feasibility study, in consultation with the advisory 10 committee established in this resolve, of the governance and 12 administrative structure of the State's workers' compensation system to determine if greater efficiencies may be gained in the 14 operational structure and processes of the Workers' Compensation Board and the advantages and disadvantages, if any, of a closer alignment of the Workers' Compensation Board with other agencies 16 in State Government; and be it further

Sec. 2. Factors to be considered. Resolved: That the study must 20 include consideration of the following factors:

22 1. Underlying policy considerations in the Maine Workers' Compensation Act of 1992 that led to the creation of the current governance structure; 24

26 2. The need for independence in the quasi-judicial functions of the workers' compensation system;

The 1997 Coopers and Lybrand business assessment and the 3. 30 progress made in implementing its recommendations;

After consultants for the consultation with the advisory committee established in this resolve, the Department of Administrative and Financial Services 14 shall determine the nature and extent of the contractual services necessary for the completion of the study in accordance with this 16 resolve and shall prepare and administer all contracts pursuant to those determinations in accordance with the Maine Revised 18 Statutes, Title 5, chapter 155; and be it further 20

Sec. 4. Advisory committee established. Resolved: That the study established in this resolve must be administered in consultation 22 with an advisory committee, consisting of 10 members, as follows: 24

1. Four members of the Joint Standing Committee on Labor, appointed jointly by the Senate Chair and the House Chair, with 26 the membership reflecting an equal balance with respect to 28 political party affiliation;

Sec. 6. Authorization to use reserve account to fund study. 8 **Resolved:** That the Workers' Compensation Board shall transfer \$125,000 from the reserve account created pursuant to the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 39-A, section 154, subsection 6 to the 10 Department of Administrative and Financial Services to fund the 12 study provided for in this resolve. The Department of Administrative and Financial Services shall transfer funds from the authorized amount to the Legislature to reimburse the 14 Legislature for its payment of per diem and expenses for Legislators who serve on the advisory committee created in 16 section 4 of this resolve. The Department of Administrative and Financial Services shall transfer all funds not 18 spent or encumbered for the study by January 1, 2002 to the Workers' Compensation Board for deposit in the reserve account. This is a one-time Services, authorization and does not apply to any ongoing use of the 32 reserve account for these purposes; and be it further 34

Sec. 8. Allocation. Resolved: That the following funds are allocated from Other Special Revenue funds to carry out the purposes of this resolve.

26	approved position reclassifications. Funding for these activities will come from the reserve account of the Workers'
28	Compensation Board.
30	The Department of Administrative and Financial Services will require an Other Special Revenue funds allocation of \$122,480 in
32	fiscal year 2001-02 to pay for a study of the governance and administrative structure of the State's workers' compensation
34	system. Funding for this activity will come from a transfer of revenue in the amount of \$125,000 from the Workers' Compensation

SUMMARY

4 This amendment directs the Department of Administrative and Financial Services to administer a feasibility study of the governance and administrative structure of the State's workers' 6 compensation system to determine if greater efficiencies may be 8 gained in its operational structure and processes. The department may enter into contracts for consulting services to assist in carrying out the study. The study is funded by up to 10 \$125,000 from the Workers' Compensation Board reserve account. The department is directed to consult with an advisory committee 12 composed of members of the Legislature, the Workers' Compensation Board, the Department of Labor and the Department of Professional 14 and Financial Regulation and the Governor's office and to report its findings to the Legislature and the Workers' Compensation 16 The Joint Standing Committee on Board by December 15, 2001. Labor may report out any recommended legislation relating to the 1.8 report of the Department of Administrative and Financial Services 20 to the Second Regular Session of the 120th Legislature.

22 This amendment authorizes the Workers' Compensation Board to use up to \$700,000 from its reserve account to fund board 24 expenses in fiscal year 2001-2002. It authorizes some of that money to fund position reclassifications already approved by the 26 Department of Administration and Financial Services, Bureau of Human Resources.
