HOUSE AMENDMENT "B" to COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 256, L.D. 300, Bill, "An Act Making Unified Appropriations and Allocations for the Expenditures of State Government, General Fund and Other Funds, and Changing Certain Provisions of the Law Necessary to the Proper Operations of State Government for the Fiscal Years Ending June 30, 2002 and June 30, 2003"

Amend the amendment by striking out all of Part M.

Further amend the amendment by inserting at the end and before the fiscal note the following:

PART Z

Sec. Z-1. 5 MRSA §1513, sub-§1-R is enacted to read:

1-R. Transfer from Maine Rainy Day Fund. Notwithstanding subsection 2 and section 1585, an amount not to exceed \$613,802 must be transferred by the State Controller from the available balance in the Maine Rainy Day Fund to the unappropriated surplus of the General Fund no later than June 30, 2002 and an amount not to exceed \$4,841,419 must be transferred by the State Controller from the available balance in the Maine Rainy Day Fund to the unappropriated surplus of the General Fund no later than June 30, 2003.

Further amend the amendment by relettering or renumbering any nonconsecutive Part letter or section number to read consecutively.

FISCAL NOTE

This amendment will have no net effect on General Fund
