An Act to Modernize the Laws Regarding Bicycle Safety.

- Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows: 2 Sec. 1. 29-A MRSA §101, sub-§9, as enacted by PL 1993, c. 683, Pt. A, §2 and affected by Pt. B, §5, is amended to read: 4 Bicycle. "Bicycle" means a device-upon-which-a-person may-ride-that-is-propelled-by-human-power-and-that-has-2-tandem wheels, --either--of--which--is--more--than--20--inches--in--diameter 8 vehicle primarily propelled by human power, operated by a person 10 usually seated on a seat and driven on the ground on wheels by the operator. 12 Sec. 2. 29-A MRSA §2063, sub-§2, as enacted by PL 1993, c. 683, Pt. A, §2 and affected by Pt. B, §5, is amended to read: 14 Riding to the right. A person operating a bicycle shall 16 ride it as far as practicable to the right side of the way, and 18 may travel on paved shoulders on the right side of the way, except when making a left turn. This subsection does not apply 20 in a municipality that, by ordinance and with the approval of the Department of Public Safety and the Department of Transportation, makes other provisions for the location of bicycle traffic. 22 24 Sec. 3. 29-A MRSA §2071, sub-§5, as amended by PL 1995, c. 371, §2, is further amended to read: 26 5. Hand signals. Signals by hand and arm must be given by the left arm from the left side of a vehicle in the following 28 manner: 30 To indicate a left turn, the hand and arm must be 32 extended horizontally; 34 To indicate a right turn, the hand and arm must be extended upward, except that a person who is operating a bicycle is not in violation of this subsection if the person 36 signals a right turn by extending the person's right hand 38 and arm horizontally; and
- 40 To indicate a stop or a decrease in speed, the hand and arm must be extended downward.
- A person who operates a bicycle shall make a hand signal for a 44 turn prior to the turn. Both hands must be on the bicycle handles during the turn.
- Sec. 4. 29-A MRSA §2084, sub-§1, as enacted by PL 1993, c. 683, Pt. A, $\S 2$ and affected by Pt. B, $\S 5$, is repealed and the 48 following enacted in its place:

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1. Night equipment. The Chief of the State Police shall adopt rules governing the use of lights and reflectors. Rules adopted pursuant to this subsection are routine technical rules pursuant to Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter II-A.

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SUMMARY

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This bill changes the general definition of "bicycle" in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 29-A, to be consistent with the definition in the Bicycle Safety Education Act. The bill clarifies that bicycle operators are permitted to travel on paved shoulders and that bicycle operators are required to replace their hands on the handlebars after signaling a turn but before turning. Finally, the bill requires the Chief of the State Police to develop new rules for the use of lights and reflectors.
