SENATE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 95, L.D. 321, Bill, "An Act to Strengthen Maine's Economic Development Incentive Laws"

Amend the bill by inserting after the enacting clause and before section 1 the following:

'Sec. 1. 5 MRSA §12004-I, sub-§6-E, as enacted by PL 1997, c. 761, §1, is amended to read:

6-E. Economic Legislative 5 MRSA
Economic Development per diem §13070-L
Development Incentive and expenses
Commission Legislators
only

This subsection is repealed August 1, 2002.

Sec. 2. 5 MRSA §13070-J, sub-§1, ¶A, as enacted by PL 1997, c. 761, §2, is amended to read:

A. "Commission" means the Economic Development Incentive Commission established in section 12004-I, subsection 6-E.

This paragraph is repealed August 1, 2002.

Sec. 3. 5 MRSA §13070-L, sub-§6 is enacted to read:

6. Repeal. This section is repealed August 1, 2002.'

SENATE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 95, L.D. 321

2 Further amend the bill by relettering or renumbering any
nonconsecutive Part letter or section number to read
consecutively.

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FISCAL NOTE

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8 The amendment eliminates the General Fund cost of the bill
by clarifying that only the business and agency reporting
requirements, and not the Economic Development Incentive
10 Commission, are ongoing.

12 The additional costs associated with the continuation of the
reporting responsibilities of the Maine Technical College System,
14 the Department of Economic and Community Development, the
Department of Labor and the Bureau of Revenue Services within the
16 Department of Administrative and Financial Services can be
absorbed utilizing existing budgeted resources.

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
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SUMMARY
