	2. Legislative member. By December 1st of every
14	even-numbered year, the Somerset County legislative delegation shall meet and select from among its members a Legislator to
16	serve as a voting member of the budget committee for the ensuing 2 years. The State Senator who represents the largest number of
18	voters within the county as tallied in the most recent election shall call the meeting. A meeting must be called at any other
20	time when necessary to fill a vacancy in the position.
